How to Make A Simple Bird Feeder

Materials:

- Pinecones, an empty paper towel roll, or a stale piece of bread
- Peanut butter or honey
- Raisins, cranberries, unsalted and unbuttered popcorn, sunflower seeds, shelled plain peanuts or mixed birdseed
- Wire, dental floss, or cotton string
- A hook to hang the feeder

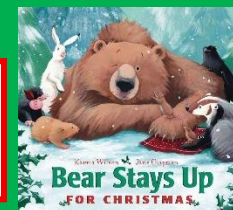
Click the link above to help children explore the beauty of the season while learning, creating and giving back to nature by making a bird feeder.
