Caregiver Tips

Talk about the change from summer to fall. Ask your child how they think the weather will change and write down their ideas. Discuss how weather can look colorful—blue, gray, or pink skies—and have them draw sunny or cloudy days. Review the weather chart together and ask what patterns they notice.
