Caregiver Tips

Choose a pinecone, paper towel roll, or piece of bread for the base of your bird feeder. Spread peanut butter or honey over the base.

Have your child mix raisins, cranberries, unsalted and unbuttered popcorn, sunflower seeds, shelled peanuts, and/or birdseed, then press the mixture onto the sticky surface.

Thread wire, dental floss, or string through the feeder and tie the ends to make a loop. Hang it outside on a hook where you can easily watch the birds visit. 🐦

How to Make a Simple Bird Feeder

Materials:

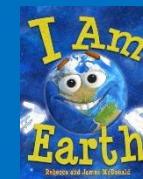
- Pine cones, an empty paper towel roll, or a stale piece of bread
- Peanut butter or honey
- Raisins, cranberries, unsalted and unbuttered popcorn, sunflower seeds, shelled plain peanuts or mixed birdseed
- Wire, dental floss, or cotton string
- A hook to hang the feeder
