Recent archaeological findings have revealed the remains of what may be the first female gladiator ever discovered. This significant discovery, made in a burial pit containing gladiatorial artifacts, challenges previous notions about the presence of female fighters in ancient Rome, as few gladiator cemeteries have been excavated without evidence of women. Notable artifacts include a marble frieze at the British Museum depicting two female gladiators in combat, and a small bronze statuette in a Hamburg Museum, once thought to represent a woman washing, but it's now identified as a female gladiator wielding a curved sword. These women, referred to as Amazon and Achillea, were not merely enslaved people, but valuable assets akin to celebrity athletes. Inscriptions indicate they did not fight to the death and participated in various combat styles, including wild beast hunts, alongside men for centuries. However, a decree in 200 AD banned female fighters from the arena, reflecting societal concerns about their impact on the perception of women.

Mrs. Hall helps plan VJ Day celebrations. Tristan's past experiences come home to haunt him. James is puzzled by the disappearance of a newborn calf.



PHOEBE & JAY is a new, animated series for children ages 3-5 that is designed to support early literacy skills for preschoolers. The series showcases the various kinds of texts kids see in their everyday lives — from signs and posters to labels and movie tickets, helping them understand, navigate and participate in the world around them.



# A four-part documentary series that explores the rich and complex relationship between Black Americans and Jewish Americans throughout history.

Black and Jewish Americans began on fundamentally different footing, but by the early 20th century, they were drawn together by entrenched racism and rising antisemitism. These shared experiences led to productive civic partnerships and sparked creative bonds that led to collaborations in music and film that would profoundly shape American popular culture. The relationship between these communities deepened after World War II, when the atrocities of the Holocaust came to light, reinforcing a sense of common struggle as both communities grappled with the devastating consequences of hatred and intolerance. The civil rights era is often described as the "golden age" of the alliance, when Jewish Americans worked closely with Black leaders and organizers to dismantle Jim Crow segregation.

While shared ideals of justice united Black and Jewish people, they were also divided by the realities of race in America. The historic alliance suffered as each group turned inward, prioritizing its own struggles and agendas in an increasingly fragmented social and political landscape. Still, the hope and promise of cross-cultural solidarity endures to this day, amid constant reminders of the persistent threat of violence and injustice in the world. BLACK AND JEWISH AMERICA offers a lesson in fulfilling that promise while confronting the challenges of maintaining unity against divisiveness.

"This is a deeply personal subject for me," said Henry Louis Gates, Jr. "It's connected to my own coming of age during the heroic days of the civil rights struggle and is an urgent response to the violent forces I've seen reawakened in our society over the last

decade. By tracing the long arc of Black and Jewish history in America, I hope we can see each other more clearly, more honestly, and find hope in our mutual stories of survival, resilience, and solidarity. But this series is not only about the past. It is about us — and how, together, we can prevail over the forces of hatred that seek to divide us."

### **EPISODES**

#### Feb 3, Episode 1 – Let My People Go

Episode 1 explores the core differences at the start of the Black and Jewish American stories, as well as overlapping struggle, faith, resilience, and early civic partnerships by the 1920s.

### Feb 10, Episode 2 – Strange Fruit

Episode 2 spotlights how Black and Jewish communities collaborated in the early 20th century on music, movies, and the universal fight against fascism, navigating tensions while shaping culture, confronting injustice, and leaving a lasting social impact.

### Feb 17, Episode 3 – The Grand Alliance

Episode 3 traces the 1960s' "Grand Alliance" as Black and Jewish communities fought for civil rights in a transformative interracial coalition, and the imbalances that quickly tested their alliance.

### Feb 24, Episode 4 – Crossroads

Episode 4 examines the shifting Black and Jewish relationship from the 1970s onward, exploring political gains, global tensions, rising hate, and the enduring lessons of coalition building and solidarity.
