Bella Abzug, affectionately known as "Battling Bella," was a force of nature in American politics during the 1970s. Easily recognizable by her trademark wide-brimmed hats and booming Bronx accent, she entered the House of Representatives with the defiant slogan, "This woman's place is in the House — the House of Representatives."

As a lawyer and a firebrand activist, she didn't just occupy a seat; she used her platform to challenge the status quo, demanding that the voices of women, minorities, and the poor be treated as central to the American legislative process rather than an afterthought.

Beyond her bold persona, Abzug was a highly effective legislator who mastered the mechanics of power to enact social change. She was a primary architect of the Equal Credit Opportunity Act, which finally prohibited banks from discriminating against women based on marital status — a revolutionary shift for women's financial independence. Additionally, she was one of the first members of Congress to champion gay rights and was a relentless critic of the Vietnam War.

Even after leaving Congress, Abzug's influence extended onto the global stage. She co-founded the Women's Environment and Development Organization (WEDO), shifting her focus toward international policy, environmentalism and gender equality. Her work at the United Nations helped ensure that women's rights were recognized as fundamental human rights worldwide.





Thoreau undertakes new "experiments" as a surveyor, scientist, and abolitionist. He writes with a new urgency as a lifelong illness begins to catch up with him.


