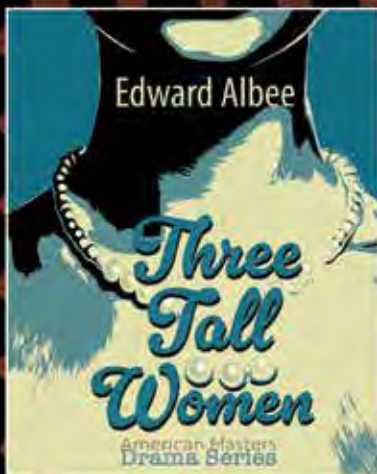

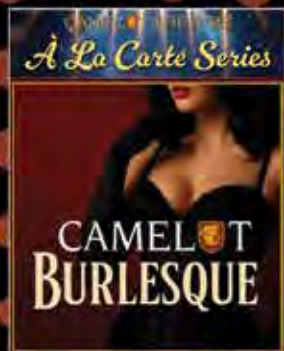

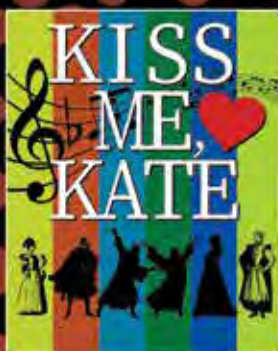

This American Masters film chronicles the extraordinary life and lasting impact of William Edward Burghardt Du Bois, from his birth in 1868, just after the Emancipation Proclamation, to his death on the eve of the March on Washington. Spanning the collapse of Reconstruction, two World Wars, and the rise of the Civil Rights Movement, the film presents a chronological portrait enriched by insights from prominent scholars and cultural voices.

Du Bois emerges as a pioneering thinker who wielded writing as a tool for justice, producing over twenty books and blending scholarship with activism. Through dramatic readings and archival materials, the documentary captures the power of his words and ideas.

In August 1969, nearly half a million people gathered at a farm in upstate New York to hear music. What happened over the next three days, however, was far more than a concert. 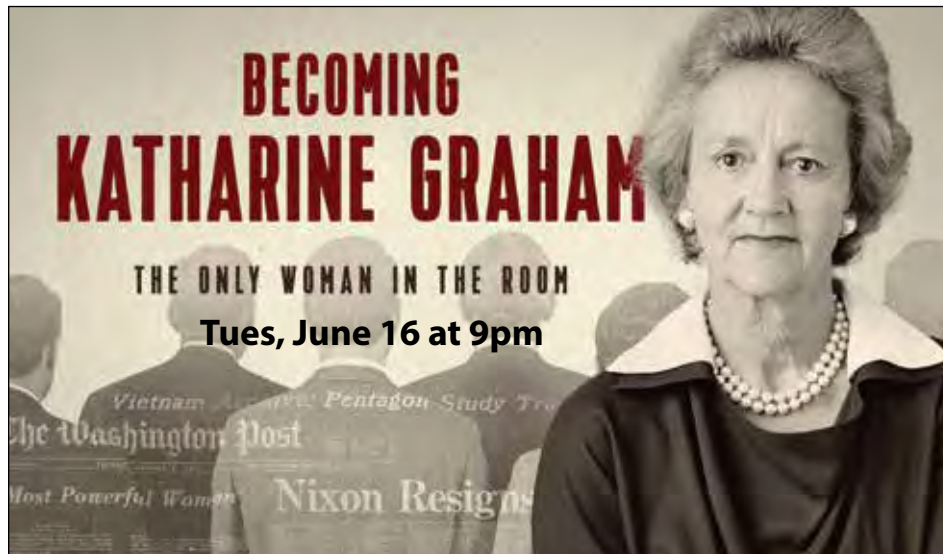

BECOMING KATHERINE GRAHAM is a profile of one of the most influential forces in modern American history. The film tells the story of Katharine Graham's accidental rise to power and how it changed history.

Born in 1917, Katharine Graham was raised to adhere to the expectation that men would have careers, and women would raise the family. Kay, like most other women at the time, abided by these societal norms. But the course of her life would drastically change once her father, financier Eugene Meyer, bought a struggling newspaper in 1933.

This struggling newspaper was The Washington Post, and it was on the brink of collapse. Though the paper's performance improved after 1933 — first under her father's leadership and then her husband's — Phil Graham's suicide in 1963 left Kay with a leaderless newspaper and four young children, forcing her to decide whether to take over the family business herself or sell it. She made the difficult and unprecedented decision to run it herself.

At its heart, **Becoming Katharine Graham** highlights pivotal events of the 1970s that occurred under Kay's leadership — the Pentagon Papers, the Watergate scandal, and a violent Washington Post pressmen's strike — as well as treatment she endured as one of the first female leaders in corporate America. Her Pulitzer Prize winning story is sure to inspire a new generation.

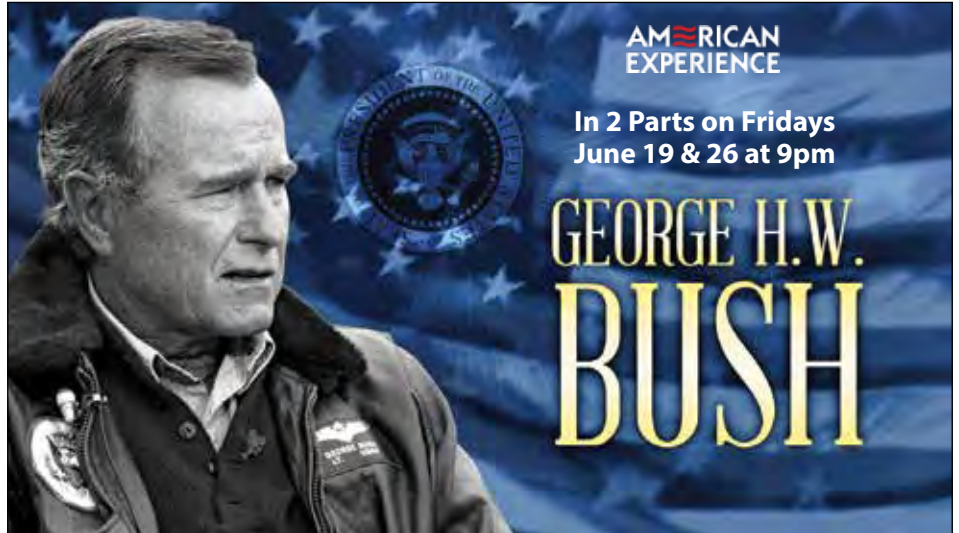

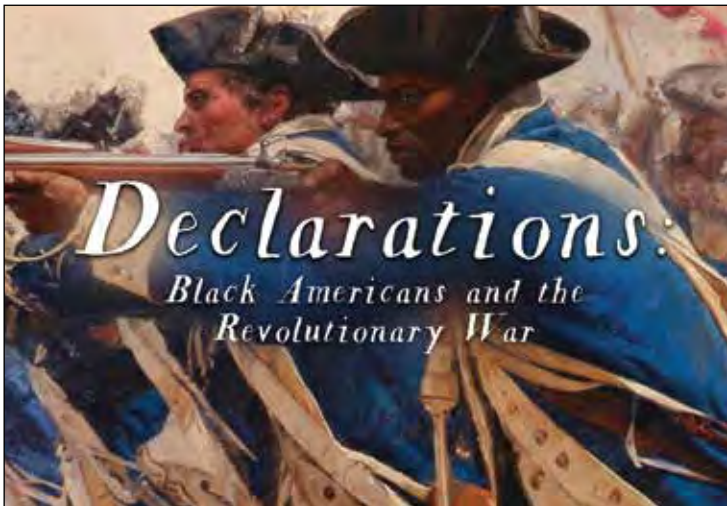

The performing arts anthology series brings best from the worlds of music and dance into viewers' living rooms. From classical music and opera to ballet and musical theater, cameras capture the stage performances of some of the best artists in the world.

May 1 – Now Hear This: The Iceland Sound

Fewer people live in Iceland than in Wichita, Kansas, yet it produces some of the best musicians in the world. May 8 – Suffs

The Tony-winning Broadway musical tells the story of the American suffragist movement and the remarkable friendships, heartbreak, and action that brought women together—or, in some cases, tore them apart.

May 15 – Top Hat

Inspired by the iconic 1935 movie musical starring Fred Astaire and Ginger Rogers, this acclaimed Chichester Festival Theatre revival recorded from the West End in January 2026 is directed and choreographed by three-time Tony winner Kathleen Marshall. When Broadway star Jerry Travers arrives in London to open a new show, he crosses paths with a model, Dale Tremont, whose beauty sleep is interrupted by Jerry tap dancing in the hotel suite above hers. Instantly smitten, Jerry vows to abandon his bachelor life to win her, but the path of true love is never easy. With a timeless score by Irving Berlin, the musical features classics such as *Cheek to Cheek*, *Let's Face the Music and Dance*, and *Puttin' on the Ritz*.

May 22 – An Evening with Nicole Scherzinger

Accompanied by a full orchestra at the Royal Albert Hall in London, Scherzinger sings a mix of beloved Broadway standards and pop hits from her career as lead singer of "The Pussycat Dolls."

The US AS WE ARE team takes a deep dive into the "Justice for Hakiym" movement; a campaign advocating for the freedom of Black wildland firefighter Brian "Hakiym" Simpson.

In 2024, Hakiym was arrested and imprisoned for allegedly assaulting a fellow firefighter. However, a grassroots network of family, friends, and social justice advocates present evidence that Hakiym was not the aggressor, but rather the victim of a racially motivated attack. His alleged mistreatment by the justice system evokes old demons in Oregon: black exclusion, sundown laws, mandatory minimum sentencing, and the prison industrial complex.

Regional reporter and filmmaker Keegan Van Hook travels all across the Oregonian landscape from the Rogue Valley to Portland and deep Eastern Oregon to speak with activists and organizational leaders in an effort to understand our treasured landscapes through the lens of social change.

Groups like BASE, Oregon Remembrance Project, and Oregon Black Pioneers present solutions to long-standing problems, finding truth and reconciliation in some of Oregon's darkest chapters while building a better environment for the upcoming generation. This is an individual story, with potentially far-reaching social implications, that challenges traditional political alignments while bringing to light Oregon's struggle to reconcile modern attitudes with a troubled past.


