Dear Fellow SOPBS Member,

I cannot thank you enough for your recent support of SOPBS. We have been heartened and gratified by your willingness to stand by us, with your letters, calls, and emails of support and your financial contributions.

I am incredibly proud to share with you that **our donors have covered the amount that we have lost in federal funding this fiscal year.**

SOPBS lost \$1 million in federal funds this budget year, which was 37% of our budget. That money would have come to us through the Corporation for Public Broadcasting, which has shut down their operations, due to the rescission of previously -appropriated federal funding for public media.

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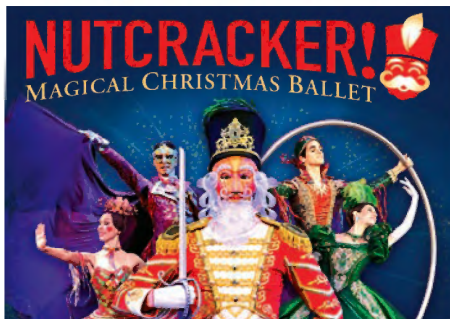

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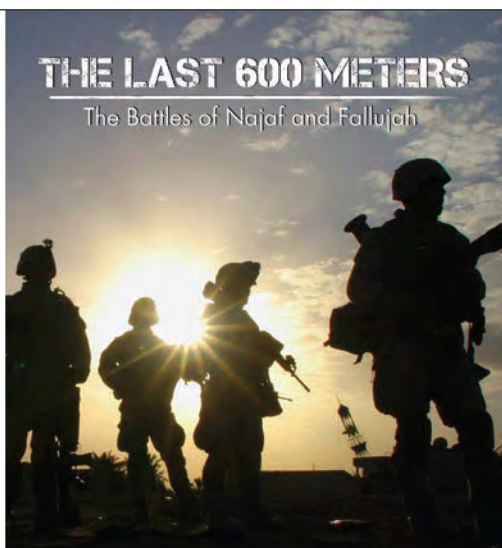

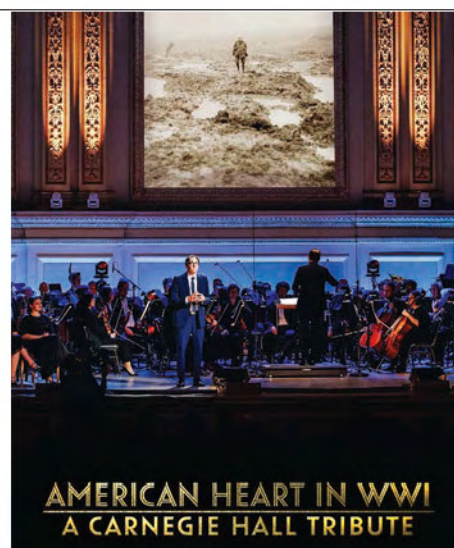

BRING THEM HOME

Mon, Nov 24 at 10pm

BRING THEM HOME examines the deeply meaningful role that buffalo played in Blackfeet life prior to the arrival of settlers who nearly eradicated wild buffalo in an effort to eradicate the Blackfeet people. For Blackfeet, the buffalo are seen not only as fundamental to a healthy ecosystem, but as spiritual relatives. Their removal from the land meant the loss of the Blackfeet way of life, the trauma of which still reverberates today.

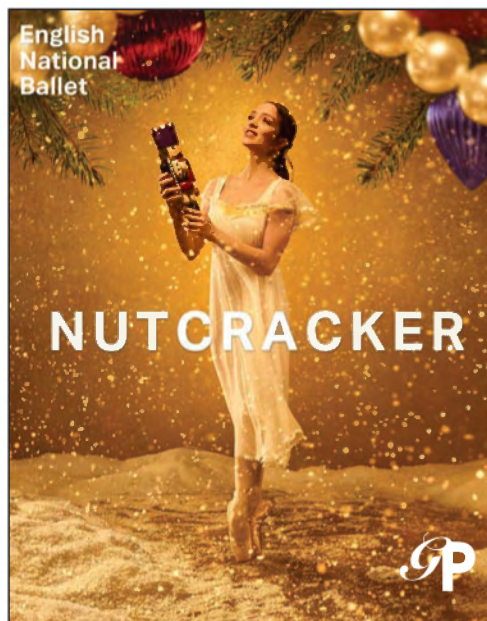

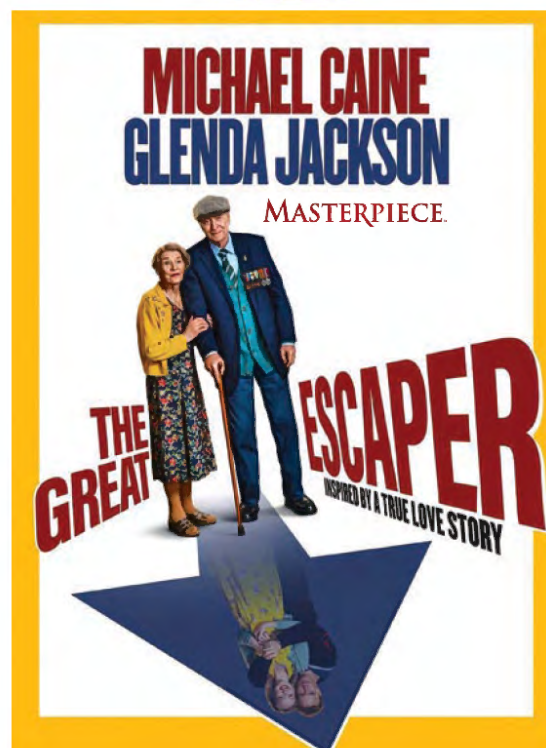

THE GREAT ESCAPER tells the true story of Bernard Jordan (Michael Caine) who made global headlines in the summer of 2014. When the 89-year-old WWII veteran went out wearing a jacket and his war medals, the care home staff thought he was planning to meet friends to reminisce about D-Day and Normandy. Bernie had other plans.

When Bernie didn't return for his tea, the care home notified the police. After checking with taxi and bus operators, neither of whom had seen Jordan that day, police officers were baffled. They should have checked with ferry and train operators, because, driven by love and the memory of fallen comrades, Jordan had hopped on a train to Brighton, and boarded a ferry across the English Channel to France to attend the 70th Anniversary of the D-Day Landings.

That night, a younger veteran called his care home to tell them Bernie was all right and staying at a hotel in Ouistreham, near the port city of Caen, France. Although his wife was aware of his travel plans, his unannounced trip caught the world's attention because of a tweet from the police that went viral.

It was a story that captured the imagination of the world as Bernie embodied the defiant, "can-do" spirit of a generation that was fast disappearing. Bernie's adventure, spanning a mere 48 hours, also marked the culmination of his 60-year marriage to Rene (the late Glenda Jackson). The film celebrates enduring love, but always with an eye to the lessons we might learn from the Greatest Generation.

On the eve of the 250th anniversary of the American Revolution, a new film explores how the nation's founding turned the world upside down. Thirteen British colonies along the Atlantic Coast rose in rebellion, won their independence, and established a new form of government that would radically reshape the continent and inspire democratic movements for generations around the globe.

Viewers will experience the Revolutionary War through the memories of those who lived it: from rank-and-file Continental soldiers to military leaders, from civilians to enslaved and free African Americans, from Native warriors to French and Spanish allies.

The American Revolution was many things: a war for independence, a civil war, and a global conflict. It affected millions from Canada to the Caribbean and beyond. Few escaped its reach. At various times, the British Army occupied every major population center in what is now the United States, including New York City, which remained under British control for over seven years.

"The American Revolution is one of the most important events in human history," said Ken Burns. "We went from being subjects to inventing a new concept, citizens, and set in motion democratic revolutions around the globe. As we prepare to celebrate the 250th anniversary of our founding, I'm hopeful that people throughout the country will come together to discuss the importance of this history and to appreciate even more what our ancestors did to secure our liberty and freedoms."

The Revolution began a movement for people around the world to imagine new and better futures for themselves, their nations, and for humanity. It opened the door to advance civil liberties and human rights, and it asked questions that we are still trying to answer today.
