BILLY THE KID – Tues, Sept 1 at 9pm

Just days from being hanged for murder, 21-year-old Henry McCarty, alias Billy the Kid, outfoxed his jailers and electrified the nation with a daring escape. He was gunned down weeks later by an ambitious sheriff, turning the young criminal into instant national headlines. First demonized by the lawman who killed him, the Kid was soon mythologized by dime-store romances and big-screen dramas. But in all the tellings, Billy the Kid's real story has been obscured.

BONNIE & CLYDE – Tues, Sept 8 at 9pm

During the Great Depression, Bonnie Parker and Clyde Barrow transformed from impoverished West Dallas youths into America's most romanticized outlaws. The reality was harsh, unglamorous, and brutal. The film examines how a public, disillusioned by economic collapse, transformed these violent criminals into legendary folk heroes, culminating in their infamous, fatal ambush by law enforcement officers in 1934.

BUTCH CASSIDY & THE SUNDANCE KID

Tues, Sept 15 at 9pm

In the late 1890s, Robert Leroy Parker (Butch Cassidy) and Harry Alonzo Longabaugh (The Sundance Kid) captivated America with the longest string of successful bank and train robberies in history. Known for their brilliant, methodical planning and a remarkably non-violent approach, they consistently outsmarted law enforcement. Pursued relentlessly across state lines by the Pinkertons, the duo eventually fled to South America.

JESSE JAMES – Tues, Oct 13 at 9pm

The documentary dismantles the myth of Jesse James as a Western Robin Hood, revealing a brutal, politically-motivated criminal born from Civil War-era Missouri guerrilla violence. Far from a romanticized outlaw, James utilized robberies for pro-Confederate vengeance, targeting the defenseless rather than sharing loot. He never traveled west, instead leading a violent lifestyle that resulted in a bloody death.

ANNIE OAKLEY – Tues, Oct 20 at 9pm

Annie Oakley was an iconic sharpshooter of Buffalo Bill's Wild West Show. Born into severe Ohio poverty, Oakley excelled in a male-dominated sport. She charmed global royalty and became a Victorian-era superstar. However, her life was filled with paradoxes; she championed women's physical education, but opposed suffrage. This film separates fact from fiction, exploring how a Quaker woman who never lived out west became an enduring symbol of the Wild West.

Oct 11, Episode 4: Grieving Cushla hunts for the truth behind the tragedy, leading to a shocking discovery that unites her family. Years later, an emotional chance meeting with a former pupil concludes her journey.

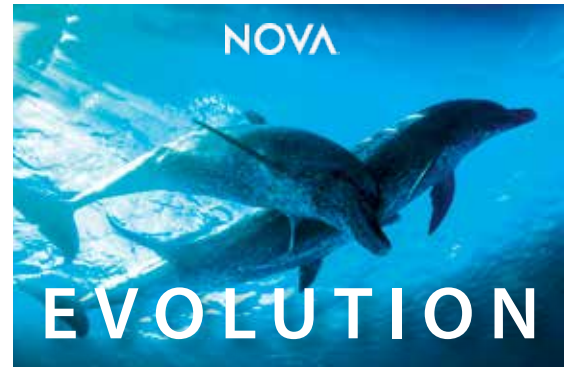

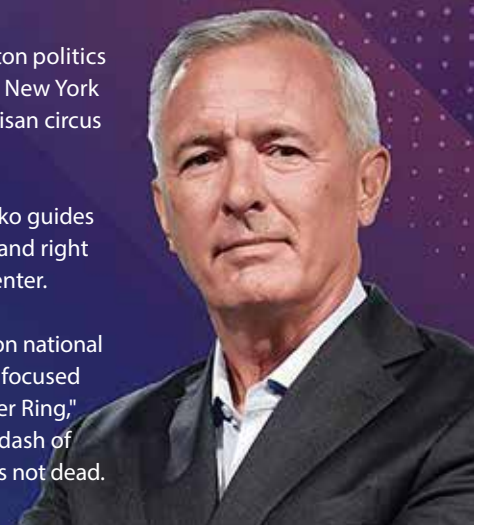
