It was a beautiful day, and such a joy to meet more than 1,500 children and their families, as well as many enthusiastic adults who shared their personal stories about the lasting impact of PBS KIDS and the invaluable role PBS has played in their education and quality of life.

This is what sets Nashville PBS apart from most media outlets. Our mission is to celebrate and connect Nashville and beyond through content and engagement that educates and reflects the communities we serve. We take that mission to heart, and I'm truly grateful to each of you and to our dedicated team for supporting it.

Fundraising Update: You're Making a Difference

Thanks to your incredible support, our fundraising efforts under the Fund Our Future campaign are going strong. The future continues to look bright as we serve our community, our region, our state, and our nation.

Nashville PBS stands strong, despite significant challenges, and you are a big part of that resilience. More than 1,300 of you became new members, and many of our current supporters increased their annual gifts or made additional contributions following the announcement of the Corporation for Public Broadcasting (CPB) shutdown.

In my decades of work in public television, I never imagined CPB would be dismantled so abruptly, or that federal funding for public media would become such a deeply divisive issue. I often ask myself to what end? The federal budget has not been significantly reduced, and our nation is not more united or better served as a result.

The decision to defund public broadcasting comes at a high cost: to local stations, to the communities we serve, and to the cultural and educational growth of our country. Around the world, successful nations support public media that informs, educates, and connects. That has always been our legacy at Nashville PBS. We are here to bring light, not heat, and we will continue to operate in a nonpartisan way, supported by individuals, businesses, and bipartisan state leadership. We remain hopeful that federal support for local stations will one day return.

A Statewide and National Vision

We're also committing to deeper collaboration across Tennessee. Nashville PBS is working alongside the state's six PBS stations and our public radio partners to explore shared content and services. A recent highlight was our successful three-day broadcast of AmericanaFest – just one example of how we are expanding our impact.

As I begin my service on the national PBS Board of Directors, I'm reminded of our collective responsibility to educate, connect, and protect through public media. In Tennessee, we're already in conversations with state officials about how our broadcast infrastructure can play an even greater role in serving as a primary emergency alert system.

A Personal Note of Gratitude

I've been privileged to enjoy a rewarding career in public television. Thank you to Nic Dugger and the Mid-South Chapter of the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences for the honor of being inducted into the Silver Circle. It was a night to remember, made even more special by the presence of family, friends, and my son, Max Magura, who gave a touching introduction. I will always cherish that evening.

At the ceremony, I took a moment to acknowledge the dedicated professionals at CPB who have served local public media stations, and our nation, with distinction for decades. My heartfelt thanks to the CPB Board of Directors, to President and CEO Patricia deStacy Harrison, and to the senior leadership team for continuing to serve with integrity and focus during this difficult transition.

Looking Ahead with Purpose

In the coming months, including during the premiere of Ken Burns' upcoming documentary series, THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION, you'll continue to see the iconic CPB message that reminds us of the vital role public funding has played in telling America's stories. Ken Burns is a national treasure. His thoughtful work captures the complexity of our history and inspires us to strive for a more perfect union - a goal that only public television could so powerfully support.

This season of gratitude is the perfect time to thank the exceptional team at PBS, along with the Board of Directors and President and CEO Paula Kerger. At a time when strong leadership is more essential than ever, PBS is rising to the challenge. Their ongoing commitment to children and families, to quality journalism, to excellence in science, history, and the arts, and to strengthening local stations, guides us as we reimagine public media for a rapidly changing world.

In Closing

What an incredible team and board we have at Nashville PBS. I'm deeply grateful for their unwavering support and commitment as we navigate these challenging times. We love our community and the people we serve. Like PBS itself, we're not going anywhere except forward.

NASHVILLE PBS PROFILE

Meagan Grisolano, Executive Producer & Senior Director of Content

A big part of Megan's job is to provide editorial oversight for all productions and ensures content focuses align with community priorities. She previously worked as the director of communications at Nine PBS in St. Louis, supporting the station in various capacities, including digital production, marketing, business development, and strategic planning. She worked as televised auction co-coordinator at WCTE Central TN PBS in Cookeville, Tennessee, and interned at WTTW during her time as a graduate student at the University of Chicago Booth School of Business.

Before earning an MBA, Megan received a Bachelor of Arts in Economics and Spanish from Vanderbilt University where she ranked 1 of 1,054 students in her graduating class. Outside of public television, Megan was a Fulbright English Teaching Assistant in Madrid, Spain, for two years.

In her free time, Megan produces videos for her YouTube channel (@MEGrisolano) about the cultural differences between Spain and the US and her lived experiences in both countries. The channel has more than 93K subscribers and 23M views.



If you could bring in any new programs or concepts that you have not tested before, but that you are passionate about, what would they be?

I would love to launch a digital-first science series on Nashville PBS. Public media audiences are hungry for engaging science content. I've seen several PBS stations succeed with science programming on platforms like YouTube with Deep Look, Gross Science, Space Time, and Eons, to name a few.

Our viewers are lifelong learners, so a series that explores questions about our minds, bodies, ancestors, and the world around us could thrive on the PBS app and our YouTube channel. We're also fortunate to have many knowledgeable partners at nearby universities and hospitals. I believe we wouldn't have to look far to find exciting research and experts who can break down complex topics in an accessible and compelling way.

What do you feel makes a Nashville PBS program successful? How do you measure success?

Above all, a successful program aligns with our mission: Nashville PBS connects Nashville and beyond with trusted content that reflects, strengthens, and celebrates our community. It also needs to address the issues our viewers have told us matter most, which are arts and culture, education, the environment, and the economy.

Every year, we conduct a Community Survey to hear directly from our audience about their

priorities. We also gather feedback through conversations at events, phone calls, emails, and social media engagement.

I tend to be data-driven, so I also track broadcast ratings, digital views, and engagement metrics like likes, comments, and shares. The most valuable thing anyone can give is their time, so when someone chooses to spend it with our content, that's a huge win.

What would hinder you from bringing a new concept to life?

There's no shortage of ideas for new programming from our team and our viewers. What stops us from running with great new ideas are limited resources. We are grateful for the support we get from foundations, corporations, major donors, and "Viewers Like You." That support allows us to produce ten ongoing local series and numerous specials each year. But with a team of just over thirty people, we can't sustainably add much more without growing our funding and capacity.

As we secure new funding, we're able to turn dream projects into reality, creating local content that reflects our region in a way national streaming giants simply can't. I also believe the more local connections and partnerships we have, the more we can accomplish. If we don't know about the incredible work happening in our community, we can't share stories about that work. The more we're able to meet people and grow our network, the more successful we'll be.

What part does the audience/member base play in the programming decisions the station makes?

Our audience plays a central role. As I mentioned, we rely heavily on feedback through our annual survey, direct engagement, and digital analytics. I regularly share performance data with our team, so we're guided by what resonates with viewers. If something's working, we'll do more of it.

That's part of why our most-watched local programs, TENNESSEE CROSSROADS and VOLUNTEER GARDENER, have stayed on air since the late '80s. They consistently deliver value to our audience.

As the media landscape shifts toward ondemand and digital platforms, we're adapting accordingly. More and more people are watching on demand and on digital platforms, so we are making sure to be on as many platforms as we can and to optimize our content.

A great example is TENNESSEE CROSSROADS: JAUNTS, a digital-first series we launched in partnership with local influencers like @nashvillehiddengems and @xplr.nash on Instagram. The series highlights noteworthy local restaurants, shops, and destinations in roughly 90 seconds or less.

At tennesseecrossroads.org/jaunts, viewers can type in any Tennessee destination and our Jaunt AI will return a curated list of nearby spots, linking to TENNESSEE CROSSROADS segments. It's just one way we're listening to what our audience wants, and building tools to serve them better.


NO MAN'S LAND



In 2008, when Becky Magura was leading WCTE PBS - years before becoming President and CEO of Nashville PBS - Hal partnered with her to develop a professional, bimonthly magazine and program guide for the station. Despite limited resources, the publication launched successfully in 2010 and, that same year, earned a National Educational Telecommunications Association (NETA) Award.

The magazine's design is unique to Nashville PBS, thanks to Editor Dr. Carolyn Adkerson, but the award-winning model remains the same. The magazine showcases the full range of Nashville PBS's offerings, from local and national programming to community events and digital viewing opportunities. An online version includes links to program trailers and more information. Funding partners and media trades make the membership magazine possible.

Over the past 18 years, Hal has collaborated with three PBS stations to develop their publications, as well as contributing to a variety of other marketing, copywriting and communications projects.

"I'm a lucky guy," Hal said. "I get to work with the positive and genuinely caring people at Nashville PBS to help them shine a light on the amazing work they're doing. It's both fulfilling and fun!"





High-Risk Build





On the 250th anniversary of the American Revolution, a new film explores how the nation's founding turned the world upside down. Thirteen British colonies along the Atlantic Coast rose in rebellion, won their independence, and established a new form of government that would radically reshape the continent and inspire democratic movements for generations around the globe.

Viewers will experience the Revolutionary War through the memories of those who lived it: from rank-and-file Continental soldiers to military leaders, from civilians to enslaved and free African Americans, from Native warriors to French and Spanish allies.

The American Revolution was many things: a war for independence, a civil war, and a global conflict. It affected millions from Canada to the Caribbean and beyond. Few escaped its reach. At various times, the British Army occupied every major population center in what is now the United States, including New York City, which remained under British control for over seven years.

"The American Revolution is one of the most important events in human history." said Ken Burns. "We went from being subjects to inventing a new concept, citizens, and set in motion democratic revolutions around the globe. As we prepare to celebrate the 250th anniversary of our founding, I'm hopeful that people throughout the country will come together to discuss the importance of this history and to appreciate even more what our ancestors did to secure our liberty and freedoms."



The Great Escaper

This is the true story of Bernard Jordan (Michael Caine) who made global headlines in the summer of 2014. When the 89-year-old WWII veteran went out wearing a jacket and his war medals, the care home staff thought he was planning to meet friends to reminisce about D-Day and Normandy. Bernie had other plans.

When Bernie didn't return for his tea, the care home notified the police. After checking with taxi and bus operators, neither of whom had seen Jordan that day, police officers were baffled. They should have checked with ferry and train operators, because, driven by love and the memory of fallen comrades, Jordan had hopped on a train to Brighton, and boarded a ferry across the English Channel to France to attend the 70th Anniversary of the D-Day Landings.

That night, a younger veteran called his care home to tell them Bernie was all right. Although his wife (Glenda Jackson) was aware of his travel plans, his unannounced trip caught the world's attention because of a tweet from the police that went viral.

It was a story that captured the imagination of the world as Bernie embodied the defiant, "can-do" spirit of a generation that was fast disappearing. Bernie's adventure, spanning a mere 48 hours, also marked the culmination of his 60-year marriage to Rene. The film celebrates enduring love, but always with an eye to the lessons we might learn from the Greatest Generation.
