With that said, you are making a difference each day. Our goal has been to close the gap of this instant funding loss, and our individual donors have risen to the occasion. Many of you have joined our Nashville PBS

family as a new member, or you have added a gift or increased your donations. As of December 2025, we are halfway to goal of replacing a million dollars. For that, we are sending you a **Million Thanks**. We are grateful for your continued support.

So, what will Nashville PBS do with a clean slate? I believe first we need to celebrate our many accomplishments of this past year, which included four Emmy nominations. Check out our recently released **24 | 25 Report to the Community** online (wnpt.org/about/report-to-the-community/), or you can pick a report up at our station.

Our Nashville PBS team is focused on the future. We are working diligently to fund that future by bringing you the best PBS content, both nationally and locally. We are also engaging in our community and partnering with key organizations. There are significant opportunities ahead of us, and we will continue to be good stewards of your cherished donations.

Outpriced and Overlooked: Older Adults and the Housing Crisis

Nashville's rapid growth has brought new excitement to the city, but it has also made it harder for older adults to find safe and affordable places to live. The newest episode of AGING MATTERS takes viewers inside this urgent issue and explores how rising costs are impacting seniors across the region.

The documentary blends expert insight with powerful personal stories, showing the realities faced by older adults as housing prices, rents, and property taxes continue to climb. Viewers will meet community partners helping seniors stay in their homes through repairs and support services, along with residents whose lives have improved through housing vouchers and other assistance. These stories illustrate how access to stable housing can completely change someone's health and well-being.

AGING MATTERS also highlights innovative efforts happening across Nashville, including partnerships that transform unused property into new affordable housing for seniors. These solutions offer hope and showcase the creativity needed to meet the city's growing demand for affordable options.

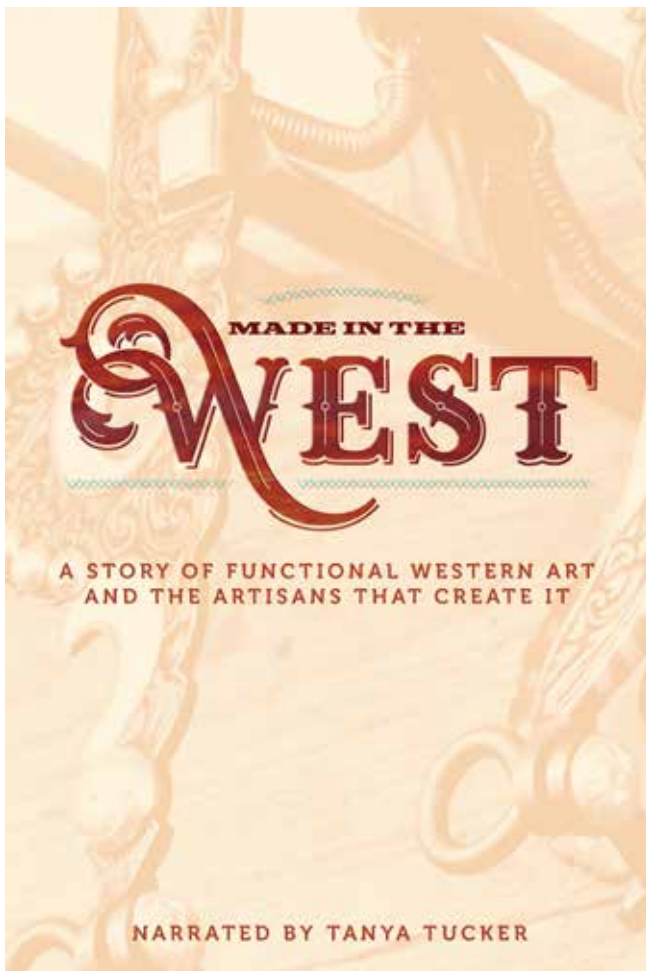

Through ten new episodes, Henry Louis Gates Jr. and his team use genealogical detective work and cutting-edge DNA analysis to trace the family trees of twenty celebrity guests, telling stories that shine a light on America's fundamental diversity and compelling similarities. As the pages turn in each guest's book of life, emotional revelations give way to complex questions about identity.

Nature: New Episodes

Tusker: Brotherhood of Elephants

Wed, Jan 14 at 7pm

Against the backdrop of Mount Kilimanjaro, meet the majestic "super tuskers," male elephants that carry the wisdom of generations, whose tusks each weigh at least 100 pounds. Fewer than 30 remain in all of Kenya. Follow the lives of Craig, Pascal, and Esau, tuskers at different stages of life, as they navigate the trials, transformations, and experiences that come with age and a shifting landscape.

The film offers a rare window into a world of male African elephants: the annual cycle of musth, a period of heightened hormones for breeding and asserting dominance, as well as tender moments among old friends. Across the open plains of Amboseli National Park and beyond, the bulls must find a balance between independence and the deep social bonds of brotherhood. Their stories reflect a lifetime of survival and strength, shaped by decades of navigating drought, conflict and human-wrought change.

Parenthood (In 5 Parts)

This natural history series explores the extraordinary strategies and ingenious tricks that animal parents employ to give their young a head start in life. From Orcas teaching their offspring to hunt Blue Whales, to Orangutans showing their young to make their beds, to Hippo families navigating the terrifying African night.



NOVA: New Episodes

Asteroids: Spark of Life?

Wed, Jan 21 at 8pm

It's hard to imagine that large meteorites colliding with Earth with the power of 20 Hiroshima bombs can bring anything but cataclysm. Ever since a link was made between meteorite impacts and mass extinctions on Earth, we have feared rogue asteroids destroying our planet. There is no doubt, these objects can be takers of life. But is it possible that giant asteroid impacts were actually essential for the creation of life on Earth?

NOVA follows a series of discoveries behind a remarkable theory of how the violent destroyers of life could also have created the very special conditions, of chemistry and energy, that made life possible.

Can Dogs Talk?

Dog lovers have long felt that man's best friend has a unique capacity to communicate with us, limited only by the fact that we don't speak the same language. But what if we did? Now, in what may be the largest animal communication study to date, researchers are observing thousands of dogs from around the world to see if owners can teach them how to "talk" to us using special buttons representing individual words. Follow researchers as they delve deeper into the canine mind to investigate the nature of learning itself.

Secrets of the Dead: New Episodes

Queens of Combat

Wed, Jan 28 at 9pm

Recent archaeological findings have revealed the remains of what may be the first female gladiator ever discovered. This significant discovery, made in a burial pit containing gladiatorial artifacts, challenges previous notions about the presence of female fighters in ancient Rome, as few gladiator cemeteries have been excavated without evidence of women. Notable artifacts include a marble frieze at the British Museum depicting two female gladiators in combat, and a small bronze statuette in a Hamburg Museum, once thought to represent a woman washing but it's now identified as a female gladiator wielding a curved sword. These women, referred to as Amazon and Achillea, were not merely enslaved people, but valuable assets akin to celebrity athletes. Inscriptions indicate they did not fight to the death and participated in various combat styles, including wild beast hunts, alongside men for centuries. However, a decree in 200 AD banned female fighters from the arena, reflecting societal concerns about their impact on the perception of women.

The Quest For Camelot

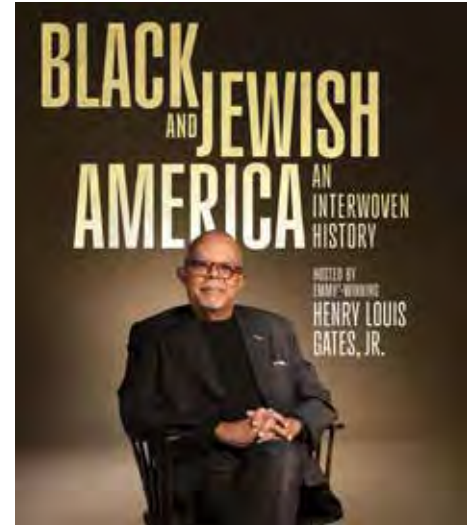
Librarians emerge as first responders in the fight for democracy and our First Amendment Rights. As they well know, controlling the flow of ideas means control over communities.

Episode 1 explores the core differences and overlaps at the start of the Black and Jewish American stories.

Feb 10 – Strange Fruit

Episode 2 spotlights how Black and Jewish communities collaborated in the early 20th century on music, movies, and the universal fight against fascism.

Episode 3 traces the 1960s as Black and Jewish communities fought for civil rights in a transformative interracial coalition, and the imbalances that quickly tested their alliance

CPB Grant Awarded To Nashville PBS

The Corporation for Public Broadcasting (CPB) announced \$4.4 million in grants to expand rural reporting in eight states. As one of the recipients, Nashville PBS will use this support to reach new rural audiences through TENNESSEE CROSSROADS and JAUNTS, partnering with rural influencers to share stories of hope, heroes, and helpers.

A three-part research project across 72 rural Tennessee counties will guide the work. The initiative envisions local influencers serving as on-the-ground reporters and community liaisons, strengthening public media's connection to rural regions and amplifying authentic voices across the state.
