FOR THE LOVE OF NASHVILLE —AND BEYOND

“IT’S FOOTBALL TIME IN TENNESSEE!” Those iconic words from announcer John Ward evoke powerful memories of our state’s rich heritage and culture. Recently, for the season opener of *Clean Slate*, I had the good fortune to speak with Carey Bringle, Owner and Pitmaster of Peg Leg Porker, about Tennessee traditions and the true meaning of community.

I loved this interview for many reasons—one being that Carey identifies as fiscally conservative and also a fan of public television. We had a great conversation about Channel 8 being his station and how the show he grew up with positively impacted his life. He also emphasized how important *TENNESSEE CROSSROADS* has been for small businesses across our state.

It reminded me that—especially in a time when everything seems to be in question—two things can be true at once: You can be fiscally conservative and still love public television. That has been the spirit of my career, and I’m grateful to meet others who know the national narrative doesn’t always reflect who we are in Nashville or across Tennessee PBS.

Honestly, I’m still processing the recent announcement about the shut-down of the Corporation for Public Broadcasting (CPB). It’s almost unthinkable that, on the eve of our nation’s 250th birthday, we would deliver such a devastating blow to an institution that truly belongs to the people.

I’ve spent my entire professional life in public service. Through PBS and our local stations, we have delivered world-class educational content that informs, inspires, and amplifies voices from all walks of life—including the beautiful rural communities I once served at WCTE, and now at Nashville PBS. I am deeply grateful for this calling.

I’m incredibly proud of our work. But without the critical support and stewardship of CPB—and the foundational federal funding it provided—so much is now at risk. For decades, our national investment in public broadcasting has produced tremendous returns. PBS has remained educational, nonpartisan, noncommercial, and truly public media.

Federal funding came in the form of a Community Service Grant, administered and evaluated by CPB to ensure that every dollar was spent wisely and with direct benefit to local communities. On average, each federal dollar leveraged an additional seven dollars in funding from other sources. That’s an extraordinary return on investment—by any measure.

In this moment of reflection, I invite you to judge our work based on the service we provide to this region. Please look past the national noise and focus on what we do here, day in and day out. We have no motive other than public service. Our commitment is to you, our fellow citizens.

My hope is that we can move beyond this fight and stand as “one nation under God” to protect what is right and good—what was built to uplift society and serve the greater good. We will stand with PBS and our fellow public media stations in Tennessee and across the country. And we ask for your support—your voice, your financial contribution at any level, and your commitment to a nation that remains “indivisible, with liberty and justice for all.”

Our republic depends on unity. And with that unity, we will continue to advocate for the restoration of federal funding for public media.

It’s important to remember that generations of Americans learned to read thanks to public television. And that’s just the beginning. Our work has always centered on families and children, but it extends into every corner of lifelong learning—from science and history to the arts and literature.

Programs like *ANTIQUES ROADSHOW*, *TENNESSEE CROSSROADS*, and *VOLUNTEER GARDENER* are just a few examples of how we celebrate our past and present, and serve our communities with purpose. Your personal federal tax investment—just \$1.60 per year—helped make all of that possible. And now, that modest but mighty investment is gone.

But we aren’t going anywhere.

Nashville PBS remains fully committed to serving this region with compassion, empathy, and purpose. We belong to you—the public—and we will continue to honor that mission. We are one of the last locally owned and governed media organizations, focused on education, community connection, and public safety through emergency alerting.

Let’s stand together with PBS and continue to deliver on our mission—for our country, for our children, and for the generations to come.

Thank you for reading. Thank you to Carey Bringle and the team at Peg Leg Porker for welcoming us and sharing your story.

And thank you to all of you who are stepping up with increased financial support during this critical time—especially those making a special gift for Nashville PBS’s 63rd birthday, celebrated the week of September 7–13! It will be a week of honoring our legacy in local storytelling and celebrating new ventures—like our live coverage of Americana Fest, in partnership with WMOT Roots Radio. Now is the time to fund the future.

Finally, as CPB begins the process of winding down with the elimination of federal funding, I want to express my deepest appreciation to CPB President and CEO Patricia De Stacy Harrison, the entire CPB team, and its Board of Directors. Their decades of service have made a meaningful difference in the lives of millions of Americans. Thank you.

I believe that our country, with its advanced economy and democratic values, will eventually realign with other developed nations and reinvest in public media.

Nashville PBS is not going away. We will stand together, work together, and deliver on our promise to be the public’s media.

Trusted. Tried. True. That’s Nashville PBS—today and always.

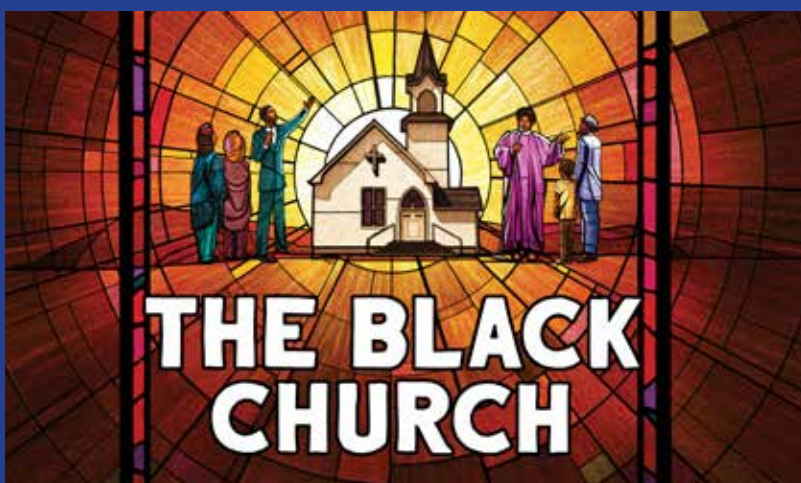

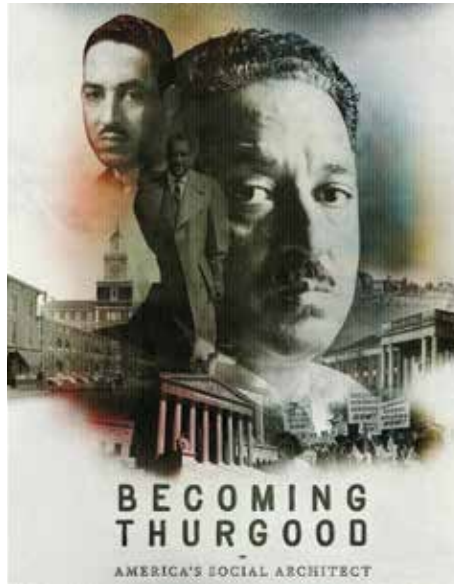

Becoming Thurgood

Series Premiere Sun, Aug 24 at 7pm

This is the story of Thurgood Marshall, the visionary lawyer and civil rights leader who became the first Black justice on the United States Supreme Court. Drawing from rare archival recordings, personal photographs, and exclusive interviews, the film offers an intimate and timely portrait of a man who reshaped American democracy.

The film traces Marshall's journey from his birth in Baltimore, Maryland, in 1908 to his formative years at Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs) Lincoln University and Howard University School of Law to his groundbreaking career as a lawyer championing civil rights and dismantling segregation.

Marshall won 29 of the 32 cases he argued before the U.S. Supreme Court, including the landmark *Brown v. Board of Education* in 1954, invalidating the "separate but equal doctrine" and ending racial segregation in public schools. But the decision was met with "massive resistance" across the South and continued to be fought in the courts for decades.

In 1967, Marshall became the first African American appointed to serve on the U.S. Supreme Court. He served for 24 years and retired in 1991.

"To those of us who know the struggle is far from over, history has another lesson," said Marshall. "It tells us how deeply rooted habits of prejudice are, dominating the minds of men and all our institutions for three centuries, and it cautions us to continue to move forward, lest we fall back."



The Big Cats 24/7 Season 2

Series Premieres, Wed, Sept 10 at 7pm

In Season 2, a team of wildlife filmmakers continues to use the latest filming technology to put you right inside the everyday lives of the Okavango Delta lions, leopards and cheetahs. They bring us back into the center of the action, with many of our favorite cats taking on new roles and responsibilities. How will these lions, leopards and cheetahs fare with the ever-changing demands and threats in their ecosystem?

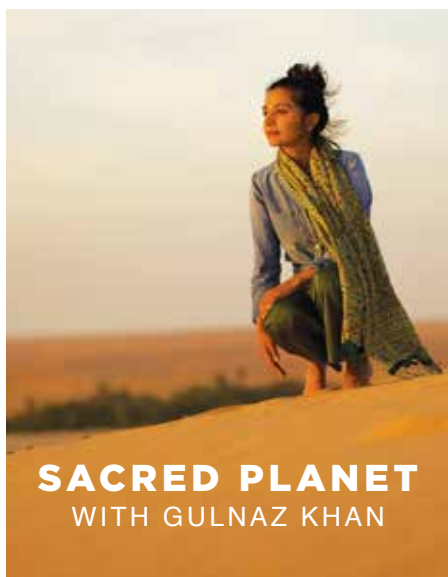
The stakes are even higher as new cubs bring added challenges. For the Xudum Pride, there are now more than 40 members, making it the largest pride in the world. This leads to increased competition for food.

The dominant male lions of the Xudum Pride, Big Toe and Madumo, are absent for long stretches, leaving the pride vulnerable to male intruders. Lioness Tsebe struggles to find enough food for her large litter of cubs. Meanwhile leopard mother Lediba must protect her cubs from potentially deadly encounters with male leopards. Similarly, cheetah mom Pobe has two young cubs to protect and feed. The series also introduces new characters, including an intruding male lion named Golden Boy, adding to the drama and tension within the pride's territory.

The Okavango Delta experiences dramatic environmental shifts, including wildfires and floods, which force the big cats to adapt and overcome new challenges. Take a captivating and emotional journey into the lives of these magnificent animals as they navigate a challenging yet dynamic environment.

Sacred Planet With Gulnaz Khan

Series Premiere Wed, Sept 10 at 9pm

SACRED PLANET WITH GULNAZ KHAN is a four-hour series hosted by environmental journalist and TED Climate Editor Gulnaz Khan. Truly cinematic in its approach, the series was filmed in Africa (Mauritania, Senegal and Ethiopia), Japan, Colombia and Peru, and is a deeply personal and often troubling examination of how climate change is impacting some of the most hallowed places on the planet. At the same time, it's also a powerful account of how faith leaders worldwide are seeking to mitigate the worst consequences of the climate crisis.

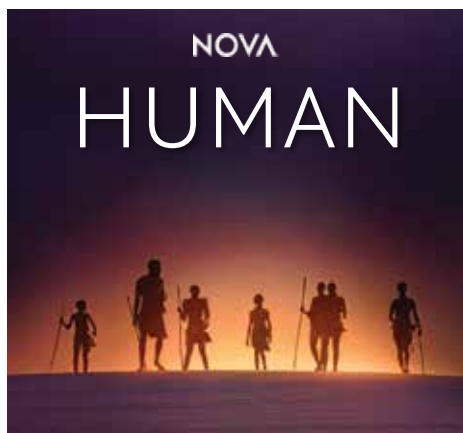

American Experience: Kissinger, Parts 1 & 2

Mon, Oct 27 & Tues, Oct 28 at 8pm

An unlikely celebrity who drew fire from across the political spectrum, Henry Kissinger is widely recognized as one of the great American statesmen of the twentieth century.

Born in 1923 in Germany to devout Jewish middle-class parents, the young Kissinger was forced to flee Hitler's regime, settling with his family in New York City in 1938. After studying at City College, he joined the U.S. Army in 1943, serving as an interpreter and intelligence officer in Europe. Kissinger returned home in 1947 to a brilliant academic career at Harvard.

Kissinger served as a part-time foreign policy adviser to the Kennedy and Johnson administrations, and was the main intellectual force behind JFK's "flexible response" strategy, which advocated maintaining both conventional and nuclear forces to respond to Communist aggression, rather than resorting to threats of nuclear retaliation.

In 1968 president-elect Richard Nixon appointed Kissinger as his national security adviser. In what *Time* magazine described as an "improbable partnership" between a "secretive, aloof... old-fashioned politician, given over to oversimplified rhetoric" and "a Harvard professor of urbane intelligence."

In 1973 Kissinger shared the Nobel Peace Prize with Le Duc Tho for secretly negotiating an end to the Vietnam War. When Nixon resigned in August 1974 and Gerald Ford took office, Kissinger retained his position and his influence on foreign affairs. Kissinger left office with the Ford Administration in 1977. He taught at Georgetown University and frequently appeared at a media consultant on international affairs.

The Gold on Masterpiece

Palmer learns he is wanted by the police. Cooper and Parry's plan to move cash across Europe is a success. Noye's murder trial comes to a dramatic conclusion.

Nov 2 - Episode 5

Palmer is finally caught after attempting to escape to Brazil. The police learn that Cooper and Parry have been laundering the Brink's-Mat millions. Cooper is arrested but Parry escapes.

Nov 9 - Episode 6

Some of the criminals are found innocent and others are convicted, but the police realize the gold was split after the robbery. Their investigation must continue in Season 2.

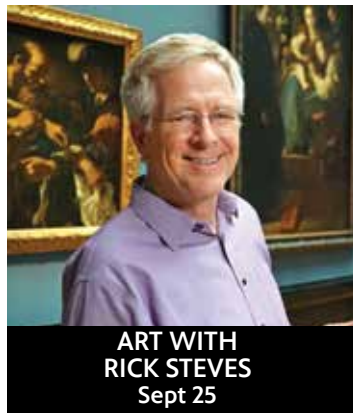

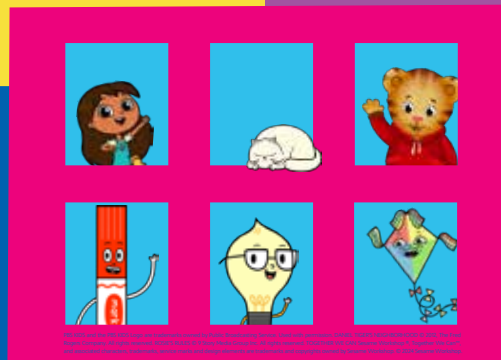
