

REMOTE CHANNEL RETIRING

WTVP's REMOTE channel is retiring at midnight on Friday, October 31. Channel 47.5 has fulfilled its purpose of filling the education gap during COVID restrictions for those with little or no internet access.

WTVP came to this decision following an audience survey, a campaign requesting feedback and months of committee research and discussions. Discontinuing **REMOTE** may improve the picture quality of our other broadcast channels and will free up resources to more meaningfully engage viewers with our other four channels.

Educational content remains one of our top priorities. We are pleased to recommend **PBS LearningMedia** for robust, free, digital, educational resources for teachers, homeschool families and school age students. We are confident that the thousands of videos, interactives and lesson plans available there will more than make up for any educational resources lost with the shuttering of **REMOTE**.





MARK LASSWELL WATCHES AMERICAN MASTERS: RITA MORENO: JUST A GIRL WHO DECIDED TO GO FOR IT

Mark Lasswell has worked for WTVP for 29 years—his job offer from 1996 still hangs on the wall of his office. He's worn many hats over the years but currently serves as **WTVP's** Director of IT and Compliance Officer. In this vital role, he manages the station's computer systems, websites and technology and keeps the board in compliance with FCC rules.

While Mark can usually be found improving his vocabulary skills watching Word Girl on **PBS KIDS**, this month he took a break to watch American Masters: Rita Moreno: Just a Girl Who Decided to Go For It with **WTVP Passport**.

Mark's first introduction to Rita was in the original Electric Company on PBS in the 1970s. He can still hear her voice opening the show with a "Hey you guys!" and he credits Rita and Morgan Freeman with teaching him how to read.

So when Mark saw that American Masters had done an episode on Rita, he just had to watch. "I love history and biographies," says Lasswell, "and PBS provides the best when it comes to that. Always has."

Mark was not disappointed. Watching the show, he was fascinated to learn that Rita and her mother moved to the U.S. from Puerto Rico during the Great Depression. Rita candidly spoke about the trials she

faced while trying to break into the film industry as a Latina. Her story of survival and perseverance inspired Mark.

He learned that even after Rita won an Oscar for her role in West Side Story, she still struggled to break through racial and gender barriers. That's when she switched to working in TV and recounted that the time period when she was in Electric Company was one of the happiest of her life.

Rita remains a force of nature. She was the first Latina to win an EGOT (Emmy, Grammy, Oscar and Tony awards) and, in spite of filming the American Masters episode at the age of 87, she is still going strong.

Mark would recommend this show to anybody who likes learning about artists and their biographies. "American Masters is really in-depth. It's not a gloss over and the quality of the footage and photography they dig up is incredible."


